

 - Certificate program-Undergraduate peer reviewers








Summer Science Program

- Rising sophomores only; no prior research experience required
- Full-time, 10 week summer session (STEM)
- \$3,000 stipend
- On-campus housing
- Specific research project with professor
- 1 meeting per week with Peer Instructors
 - Research ethics, poster design and presentation, abstract writing, etc.
- Final poster presentation
- Applications Open In Early January 2024











Research Assistant Program

- Sophomores, juniors and seniors; no prior research experience required
- Minimum of 5 hours of research/week with professor
- 2 meetings per month with Peer Instructors
 - Research ethics, poster design and presentation, abstract writing, etc.
- Undergraduate Research Symposium
- Applications Open Early March 2024 for next Academic Year
- All Disciplines (Social Sciences, Humanities, Arts, etc.)









Annual Undergraduate Research Symposium-20th Annual: April 26, 2024

- Over 500 students from more than 70 departments
- University-wide gathering of undergraduate researchers to present posters on their findings to an audience of faculty/staff, peers, alumni, corporate and community partners, and high level university administrators
- > STEM, social sciences, humanities, and arts are all represented
- Judging for best posters

Research Grant:

For more advanced researchers with an independent project

- Used solely for research costs (lab materials and supplies, etc.)
- Research Grant Application opens August 31, 2023-October 15, 2023
- Conference Funding:
 - Opens Monthly
 - Must apply a month prior to the conference

- Represent and promote Aresty at campus events




